Established in 1972, Wonderland Camp has been a vacation destination for many individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities over the years, and the popularity of the program seems to grow each year.

Founded by Charles J. Miller and located on property near Eldon MO owned by he and his brother-in-law Harry Brown, the program served 173 individuals in its first year; today, the program serves over 1,000 individuals each summer. Wonderland Camp was initially sponsored by the Missouri State Division of Mental Health, United Cerebral Palsy of Missouri, the Woodhaven Learning Center, and Missouri Jaycee.

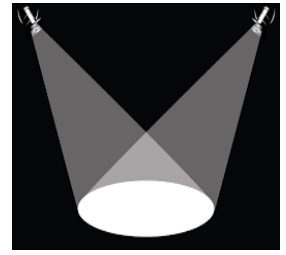
